Eric Arthur Blair, better known by his pen name George Orwell , was an English novelist, essayist, journalist and critic, whose work in marked by lucid prose, awareness of social injustice, opposition to totalitarianism and outspoken support of democratic socialism.

"Tea is one of the main stays of civilizations in this country"

- George Orwell

One of the most influential statement of the British 'way of tea' is George Orwell's essay. 'A nice cup of tea published in the evening standard on 12 January 1946. It was written at a time when tea was rationed and is short supply, against the backdrop of serve food shortage across Europe. The process of tea making is a subject matter of violent disputes. The author has come up with eleven golden rules for preparation of a nice tea. First he begins to insist on using an Indian or Ceylonese Tea, to feel wiser, braver and more optimistic. Tea should be made in small quantities' in a china or earthenware. The pot should be warmed beforehand. Tea should always be strong and it should be put straight into the teapot. We should take the teapot to the kettle and after making tea, one should stir it well. Tea should be drunk out of a cylindrical type of cup, as it hold more tea. Milk that is too creamy always given the tea, a sickly taste. So we should pour the cream of the milk. Two of these rules are generally agreed by the public, but at least four other are actually controversial. 'What should be poured first in the cup' has become a subject of controversial points. George Orwell says that one should pour tea first in the cup. While most of the people prefer to add sugar in the tea, the author says to add pepper or salt to it. If we drink tea without sugar for a fortnight, we would never ruin tea by sweetening it again. He claims that there are some mysterious social etiquette surrounding the tea pot. It is vulgar to drink tea out of one's saucer. There are some subsidiary uses of tea leaves such as telling fortunes, predicting the arrival of visitors, feeding rabbits, healing burns and sweeping the carpet.

EDMUND HILLARY

Sir Edmund Hillary (1919 -2008) was one of the greatest explores and mountaineers of the twentieth century. His conquest of mount Everest and the south pole inspired generations of adventures and dreamers. This story of 'The Summit' narrates the achievement of Edmund Hillary and Tenzing Norgay. They achieved success in climbing to the summit of the Mount Everest. John Hunt led the expedition to Mount Everest on May 29th 1953, six men started for the expedition. They were Edmund Hillary, Tenzing, George Lowe, Alfred Gregory and the two Sherpas, Pemba and Ang Nyima. As Pemba was too ill to climb, others climbed that day to a height of 27,900 feet. At 4 a.m., they began to get ready for the **<u>climb.</u>** Hillary dragged their oxygen sets into the tent, cleaned the ice off them and then rechecked and tested them. They pulled three pairs of gloves on to their hands. At 6.30 am, they hoisted 30 lb. Of oxygen gear on to their backs, connected their masks and turned on the valves to bring life into their lungs. They traversed back towards the ridge. The soft snow made a route on top of the ridge both difficult and dangerous. As one person was belaying, the other person would go on cutting.

> I literally cramponed backwards up the crack, praying that the cornice would remain attached to the rock. My progress although slow was steady.

They had to escape the large overhanging cornices by cutting a line of steps down to where the snow met the rocks on the west. The time was passing and the ridge seemed never-ending, Hillary looked upwards to see a narrow snow ridge running up to a snowy summit with a few more whacks of the ice-axe in the firm snow, they can be on the top. They were relieved and grinned at each other, as they looked all around them .

They shook hands and thumped each other on the back until they

were breathless. It was 11.30 a.m. He felt that the important photograph was a short down the North Ridge, showing the North col. Tenzing made a small hole in the snow and placed various small articles of food in it. Hillary also made a small hole in the snow and placed in it a crucifix, which was given to him by John Hunt. They scrambled cautiously over the rock traverse , moved one at a time over shaky snow sections and finally cramponed up their steps and back on to South Peak. They reached their tent at 2.00 p.m. Then they turned downwards safely descended the ridge to the South Col. It was an unforgettable day for them. They had climbed to the top. There were shouts of joy, handshakes and hugs for the two heroes. The adventure was over <u>. They made the impossible possible.</u> They proved 'There is no height, no depth that the spirit of man

guided by a higher spirit, cannot attain'. "There are Everest to be climbed in our everyday life".

His Military skill and genius have won him many admirers.** When the poem begins, we get a description of the great warrior Napoleon standing on a little mound and watching the war anxiously. His mind was oppressive with many thoughts and he felt that all his ambition plans would become futile if they failed (the army leader Lannes) to conquer Ratisbon.

> Out twixt the battery-smokes there flew. A rider, bound on bound Full-galloping ; nor bridle drew until he reached the mound.

Though the poem does not give a detailed description of the battle, **We come to know that the young boy has played a vital role in bringing triumph to the French army.** The young boy riding at great speed approached the mound where Napoleon stood, in smiling joy. As he came closer, the narrator observed that the rider, a young boy, was severely mounded. The **boy had kept his lips compressed to stop the blood coming through.**

gave the happy news of Victory to the emperor. He informed the emperor that they had won Ratisbon for him and he himself had hoisted the flag of France. Soon his eyes softened when he saw that the boy was fatally wounded. Like a caring mother eagle, he asked the boy if he was wounded. This question touched the soldier's pride and he replied that he was killed and fell dead, smiling beside his chief. Courage and patriotism are the basic qualities of not only an emperor, but also every soldier. Soldiers fight their enemy not only for monetary considerations, but for the honour of their motherland. It is evident that the young soldier obtained virtues like devotion to duty, patriotism, gallantry and chivalry from Napoleon, the legendary warrior. This one act play particularly shows how easily people forget their moral values and principles. We can see the battle between <u>'self'</u> and <u>'society'</u> in <u>the Character of Mr. Robert Baldwin, the secretary of a bank and the</u> <u>bank President Mr. John Gresham</u>. Robert Baldwin is the Protagonist of this play. He leads a simple life with his wife Martha and his son John and daughter Evie. He is a man of Principles. He is an honest, diligent and hardworking employee . <u>He</u> <u>has been Working in the bank for more than 35Years. He is not ready to make any</u> <u>kind of compromise with his morality</u>. He is Working under John Gresham in a Bank. Baldwin had been thick friend for over 30 years and Baldwin had even named his son after Gresham. <u>When his friend John Gresham was arrested for the</u> <u>misappropriation in bank account, Baldwin was not ready to make any Kind of</u> <u>compromise and decided to part with him</u>. Just before being arrested Gresham offered him one hundred thousand dollars to just say <u>"I don't remember</u>".

The play brings a positive note when the bad people get punished and the good people get rewarded

Both Martha and John were Very happy to get a huge sum from Gresham, so that their family would also grow rich to some extent. When they came to know that Baldwin had rejected the generous offer made by Gresham and justified Gresham's act of offering money, stating that it was a compensation for his low salary. So they started convincing Baldwin to accept the bribe. John also accused Baldwin of betraying his dear friend Gresham. He also told that Baldwin will not get an employment anywhere, as he will be considered a traitor. John compelled Baldwin to accept the money offered by Gresham. Thus Martha and John reacted in an unjust way when Baldwin had rejected the generous offer made by Gresham. Baldwin, felt disgusted with himself and the attitude of his family members. To save Baldwin, Mr. Marshall, president of the Third National, Visited him and informed him that Gresham had confessed his crime, in order to free him from betraying his trusted friend and testifying painfully against him. Mr. Marshall also offered Baldwin a job in his Bank, to reward him for his '**honesty'** and '**Integrity'**. At the end of the play the reader realizes that money only brings '*isolation'*, '*punishment'*, '*deception'*, 'frustration' and 'endless shame'. Money has a great influence on people but not on truthful- Virtues get rewarded.
